### See All - Hear All - Feel All

We live in a society that strives for a better future. Unfortunately, for families suffering from domestic violence, that future isn't so bright.

The tragic circumstance of Chlœ Valentine's death in 2012 shocked our state and shone a spotlight on how child abuse and neglect are an insidious part of domestic violence (DV).

DV is not just intimate partner violence, it involves the whole family. Children are the innocent and silent victims of today who see all, hear all, feel all. Statistics reveal cycles are often repeated, creating a new generation of victims and perpetrators.

So far this year, as quoted by the new Prime Minister in his first week, a staggering 63 women have lost their lives due to DV situations (and rising). This figure doesn't include the vast number of families that continue to be severely damaged by the ongoing and terrifying effects of DV, much of which still goes unreported and unidentified by authorities

The \$100 million recently committed by the Prime Minister to stamp out this scourge is a positive step in the right direction. However, so much more needs to be done to prevent this debilitating and insidious form of abuse, which tears apart the very fabric of our society.


We all need to listen and learn from those who bravely speak out about their fearful experiences.
